Call to order

The meeting was called to order at 1:01pm by Charmaine Martinez.

At the initial quorum count, the meeting continued once 30 members signed in as present, thus meeting quorum. In total during the meeting, 48 members signed in as present out of 394 total, with 30 needed to reach quorum.


Jeff Tyrrill, Assistant Secretary, on behalf of Tracy Creel, Secretary, presented slides [lightly copy-edited]:

New business

Proposed bylaws amendment vote

- Our bylaws amendment has been approved by the board on September 28 and is now up for a vote of approval by the membership today.
- These are the major changes in the proposed bylaws amendment:
 - Formal support for remote membership meetings over platforms such as Discord and Twitch, like we've been doing.
 - Option to hold elections and other membership votes online over several days, an option permitted by Oregon law.
 - Terminology update: The term "general meeting" is being retired—they will just be called "membership meetings" (or "regular meetings" except for the annual meeting).
 - Update to the process of holding board of director votes outside of board meetings.
 - Quorum adjustments for membership and board meetings.
- Whole bunch of more stuff, but it's all little details. The objective of this amendment is to bring us in line with Oregon state law, Chapter 65, concerning nonprofit organizations.
- The final version of the bylaws amendment is the same version first presented to the membership on September 17.

After brief questions and answers, the membership vote began.

Voting was performed using the Ghost Neko bot. During the vote, the bot ended the voting, reporting that the bylaws amendment was approved, when the number of votes reached a majority of those registered for quorum, which was unexpected. Members wishing to register their vote and have it counted were instructed to DM the bot (on either Discord or Twitch) to be included in the official count.

When the bot closed the vote, the publicly evident vote count as displayed by the bot was 24 votes in favor, 0 votes opposed, and 1 registered abstention. It was declared that the bylaws approval had passed, with a promise of a full vote count to be reported once tabulated.

[Secretary's note: On October 16, the vote count was reported as 29 in favor with 0 opposed, with 1 registered abstention, taking into account privately sent votes during the meeting. This was a correction for the vote count reported on October 9, of 28 in favor and 0 opposed, with 1 registered abstention. A member contacted us on October 11 with a complaint regarding how the vote was conducted, and the organization responded privately, and also sent a follow-up statement to the members on October 16 that also included the above-reported vote count.]
