Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:05pm by Brian Mathews.

 - Attendees from ages 13–17 must have a parent permission form and one of the above forms of identification. If they do not have one of the above forms of ID other acceptable forms of ID are...
 - School ID from the current school year.
 - Parent or guardian with them at time of check-in. (Use the parent's ID in place of the attendee's.)
 - Attendees under age 13 must have an attending adult with them at all times while in convention space, as well as a parent permission form on file.



Treasurer


Jo Ayers, Treasurer, prepared slides, and Brian presented them [lightly copy-edited]:




This chart is for people who like to see everything at the same time. It's pretty busy though—there's these columns going up from zero for the income, columns going down from zero for the expenses, and then these zaggy lines all over to show the net effect of the income combined with the expenses. Let's break it out one by one.




Here's Income: Income in May and June were way above our conservative estimates—with a lot of credit to DigiKumo Lite. July didn't quite reach prediction, partly because most exhibitors who


have paid so far did so in June instead of July. But July also saw, like, six VIP registrations after DigiKumo. So wow.




- Expenses have mostly been lower than planned, or only just a bit higher. June was a deposit on the venue, as was January, so those were huge as expected.
- o Directors really held back on July spending.



- o These lines are what happen when you combine the numbers from the previous two together.
- o So you can see that so far we've maintained pretty well above the plan.



o So here they are all combined again, so you can really see how the effects of things compare.



- Now, this one I'm pretty excited about. The bright red projection line represents what we thought (okay, feared) would happen to our bank balance if everything happened as predicted when we wrote the budget. "Zero" is right about the middle of the vertical axis, meaning overdrawn or in debt by the end of August and not pulling our way out of it. It was pretty scary to contemplate.
- But! The green line is what has actually happened to the balance so far this year! Thanks to
 everyone promoting Kumoricon by word of mouth and being supportive of our social media
 channels, we are a lot better off than we expected.
- The purple dashed line is the projection for the rest of the year if you don't change anything except shift the tail of the year up to meet the end of July. So, we're not out of the woods yet. October and December are still dangerous. We still need everyone's support—do whatever Panda says for promoting the con, and go to your managers or directors if you have an idea for cutting (or postponing) costs or creative ways to generate income. We are definitely not the only source of great ideas, so we need you.

Accessibility services

Brian presented slides:

- We strive to make Kumoricon a welcoming place for attendees and staff with disabilities. As part of this, we offer attendees with disabilities the option to skip the regular Registration line and receive service at the Registration management desk. Attendees may also opt to receive a sticker on their badge from Registration that indicates additional disabilities accommodation. Attendees can visit the Operations Office for accessibility needs throughout the convention.
- We offer additional training to some of our staff for expertise in handling accessibility issues. However, these basic guidelines apply to all staff:
 - Treat people with disabilities with the same respect and courtesy as you would any other person.
 - Be extra patient.

- Do not talk to the disability, talk to the person. For example, when talking to someone using an interpreter, talk directly to the person, not the interpreter. (This goes for people who are hard of hearing, as well as those who speak a foreign language.)
- Not all disabilities are visible. If someone says they have a disability, believe them. A person's
 disability is often a personal matter. Do not unnecessarily question them about it. If they bring up
 the subject, you may continue based on your own comfort level.
- You may offer assistance, but do not force it upon them as most prefer to be as independent as
 possible. When assisting, listen carefully to their instructions.
- Wheelchairs, canes, crutches or other assistance devices are considered to be an extension of the person's body. Coming into contact with the device is the same as contacting the person's body. If they need assistance with the device, you may do so with permission only. Medical devices, such as canes, do not require peace-bonding if they are not an intentionally themed part of a costume.
- o If you are uncomfortable for any reason, discreetly switch places with another staffer.
